BIG CAL's Festive Fun at ACE Place Childcare

"We have loved having BIG CAL with us at ACE Place Rodger Drive, Crawfurd Road and Riverside settings. Children of ages 3 to 12 have all been introduced to CAL and used CAL during our discussions about the Wellbeing Indicators.

- The children discussed what they eat to stay healthy
- The children shared how they keep healthy
- Staff shared a video with the children and reflected on what the video shared with them about keeping healthy
- The children then tried some yummy fruit and discussed the flavours and textures
- We spoke about the GIRFEC Indicators on BIG CAL's tentacles and what the words mean
- We then had discussions about different scenarios where we need to be safe at home, nursery and on the roads
- Children showed a great awareness of being safe and were able to share their experiences with each other of times where they had to be safe or when someone else kept them safe too
- Together we discussed the definition of each wellbeing indicator and then we listened to each other's perceptions of these words and how they're displayed throughout our nursery day
- At our Crawford Road site, we used BIG CAL to show the link between the Wellbeing Indicators and our emotions, using the

colour monsters."


